NEU Teacher Strike Action

You will be aware that the NEU have declared strike action for their teacher members, which has been set for the following dates;

Wednesday 01st February, Tuesday 28th February, Wednesday 15th March and Thursday 16th March

As mentioned in my letter sent via Seesaw last week, it is very possible that learning may be disrupted on these dates. We hope to be able to share further information with you later this week, if we are able to, regarding any partial or full closure of school on Wednesday 01st February. However, you may be aware that NEU members do not have to confirm their intention to strike or they may later decide not to strike, having originally signalled their intention to do so. We strongly recommend that you start to explore alternative childcare arrangements, should they be needed.

Safeguarding

We are very aware that patterns of family life vary and there is no one, perfect way to bring up children. Good parenting involves caring for

children's basic needs which includes:

- Showing them warmth and love
- Providing the stimulation needed for their development and to help them achieve their potential
- Providing a stable environment where they experience consistent guidance and boundaries.

As a parent, carer, neighbour or anyone in contact with children and families you may at times have concerns about the welfare of a child. These could be concerns about their development, appearance or behaviour which may indicate signs of abuse.

If you have concerns about a child you can and should seek advice from professionals. The Integrated Access and Referral Team **0300 123 7047 (option 1)** will give advice and guidance about making referral. If you believe that a child or young person is at immediate risk, this should be reported without delay to the police service as a 999 emergency
