As always, our staff have also made a great start to the year. As a school, we are highly committed to training, which ensures our pupils & staff have access to the very best pedagogy, enabling the culture of our school to be one of reflectiveness and proactivity. Already this year: Subject Leaders have taken part in Subject Leader training, alongside other professionals, developing and refining their plans; all staff have taken part in 'What about me?' Trauma informed training so that we can best support every child in our care; all class teachers have worked with external Literacy consultants to ensure that our writing judgements and targets are accurate; and our staff, who are English Specialist Leaders, will be developing and supporting other schools across the county. Mrs Gibbons has taken part in her training 'Making a difference to Disadvantaged Learners,' Mrs Hughes has taken part in further ELSA (Emotional, Literacy, Support, Assistant) training, while myself and Mrs Robinson will be taking part in the first very exciting 'Learning without Limits' training programme on Thursday. I continue be proud to lead a team of such talented and reflective professionals who, even in these most difficult of circumstances, are so keen to do their very best for the children in their care.

Nursery

Long before my time here at Mill View, there was a vision to provide high quality Nursery Provision for our community and families. We are now at the point where this will become a reality and we are excited to open the doors of Little Wrens Nursery after Easter.

Last week we met with our contractors to discuss final plans for the ground and building work for our Nursery. Covid cases in school

As you are aware, we have recently had **a number of positive cases** across school, with three classes currently at different stages of 'outbreak' due to three or more positive cases. Unfortunately, Mrs Gray, our school cook, also tested positive at the end of last week and I will be working from home for at least the next 5 days after testing positive this morning. We continue to do all we can to ensure consistency for our children as we manage the challenges of the current situation. It is absolutely essential that children are regularly tested before they attend school.

If a child is in a class that has an outbreak, or if they live with someone who has tested positive, they **must take a test daily** before attending school. LFT tests can be ordered at <u>https://www.gov.uk/order-coronavirus-rapid-lateral-flow-tests</u>. We thank you for supporting us in our attempts to further limit the spread.
