**Dear Families** 


Welcome to our latest school newsletter!

## **Expeditionary Learning Projects**

Team Kestrels invited their families and others from our community to school to launch their incredible immersive trail along the canal in Chester. They produced leaflets which give full instructions, directions and QR codes for anyone who would like to learn more about the history of the Shropshire Union Canal, how canals were used, how they changed life, what it is like to live on a canal boat, all about locks, tunnels and bridges, how canals were built and how waterways have changed over time. Do pick up a copy from the office if you'd like to follow the trail which has a great walking route with plenty of possible stop off points for refreshments!





## **Out and About**

A huge thank you to all our helpers who make it possible for us to take our children out and about on trips!

**Team Robins** have been doing lots of learning this term about how things grow and taking care of the sunflower seeds they planted with Mrs Kennedy. They had a great adventure to Ness Gardens and were not at all put off by the rain! They were great nature detectives and represented Mill View really well.



**Team Sparrows** have been learning all about the history of Chester Zoo and the founder George Mottershead. They watched videos, read newspapers and produced their own fact files. This was linked to their Science learning about animals including animal groups and diets. They had a great time on their visit to **Chester Zoo** including a fabulous workshop where they met Winnie the Owl, one of the special lanterns from the Zoo. Sparrows followed Winnie around the Zoo to find different animals, learning about endangered and extinct animals, playing games, waddling like penguins and standing on one foot like a flamingo. Sparrows shared lots of their Science learning with the zoon keeper who was very impressed!



**Team Falcons** went on their residential to the PGL site at Boreatton Park. They took part in a huge range of outdoor activities while they were there and showed incredible TEAM work and determination.

#### **OFSTED**

As you know we had a 2 day inspection from OFSTED in May. Across the 2 days the inspectors were in school they had a chance to speak to many of your children who were brilliant at telling them all about our school, how it works, their learning and our school values. We were really pleased with the large numbers of parents and children who took time to complete feedback to give their viewpoints on the school. It takes 35 working days for the report to be published and we will share this with you as soon as it is available.



## **Healthy Hearts and Minds Trail**

As you know we are in the process of creating our Healthy Hearts and Minds Trail around our grounds to enhance the play opportunities for all our children during playtime and lunchtimes. This is being funded through donations received towards a charity of Mrs Hughes' family's choice. Her family donated the money raised to school for a project such as this. Our PTA have also match funded the amount raised.

Our school councils have come up with a great range of themed 'Zones' which will be signposted and resourced. As part of the project we thoroughly enjoyed welcoming the artist Sarah Gallagher-Hayes from Twigtwisters. Sarah provided a series of workshops across the year groups and together we have created large willow sculptures and smaller pieces to form part of our trail. We look forward to its official launch on Sports Day.
